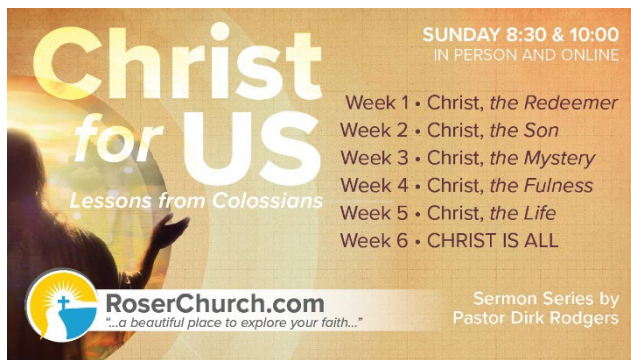

1. One _____

*“For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and **please him in every way**....” Colossians 1:9-10a (NIV, 2011)*

2. Four _____

*“...**[B]earing fruit** in every good work, **growing in the knowledge of God**, **being strengthened** with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, and **giving joyful thanks** to the Father....” Colossians 1:10b-12a (NIV, 2011)*

3. Five _____

*“...[W]ho has **qualified you** to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light. For he has **rescued us** from the dominion of darkness and **brought us** into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have **redemption**, the **forgiveness of sins**.” Colossians 1:12b-14 (NIV, 2011)*

4. How can we be sure that we are bearing fruit, growing in knowledge, being strengthened and giving thanks? Why are these important activities if our goal is to please God?
5. How can the things God has done, mentioned in verses 12-14, inspire us even more to please Him?
