1. _____ for Sacrifice

“On the fourteenth day of the first month, the exiles celebrated the Passover.”

Ezra 6:19 (NIV, 2011)

2. _____ of Sacrifice

“The priests and Levites had purified themselves and were all ceremonially clean. The Levites slaughtered the Passover lamb for all the exiles, for their relatives the priests and for themselves.” Ezra 6:20 (NIV, 2011)

3. _____ to Sacrifice

“Your boasting is not good. Don’t you know that a little yeast leavens the whole batch of dough? Get rid of the old yeast, so that you may be a new unleavened batch—as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore let us keep the Festival, not with the old bread leavened with malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.” 1 Corinthians 5:6-8 (NIV, 2011)
